So the next few months it's all about new words.

To support my writing life, I subscribe to lots of different newsletters and podcasts. One that stood out for me recently was K.M. Weiland's **Helping Writers Become Authors** podcast. The episode "Imposter Syndrome For Writers Is a Real Thing (+ the Key To Slaying It)" has some great advice on this common challenge. Worth listening even if you're not a writer, as I think people in many roles feel the agony of imposter syndrome.

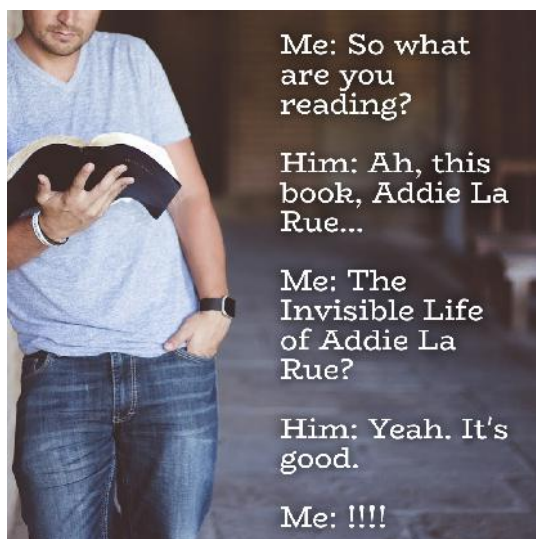


One of my favourites!
